THE COOPERATIVE NURSING PROGRAM

Trinitas School of Nursing, Elizabeth, New Jersey and Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey conduct a Cooperative Nursing Program.

The Cooperative Nursing Program awards a Diploma in Nursing from Trinitas School of Nursing and an Associate in Science Degree from Union County College upon successful completion of the curriculum.

Fully accredited by the New Jersey State Board of Nursing and the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission, Inc., the program offers a basic course of study in nursing. It provides a sound theoretical base of knowledge in nursing, biological, behavioral and sociological sciences and integrates this knowledge into academic and practical experiences within the health and illness continuum of client care. Utilization of a variety of health care agencies facilitates the application of all aspects of the students' learning.

Students earn a total of 75 credits in the Cooperative Nursing Program. Upon graduation, students are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX) for Registered Nurse Licensure. **A favorable criminal history background check and a negative drug screen are required by the School for matriculation into clinical nursing courses.**

Science and liberal arts courses (general education) may be completed at the Elizabeth, Plainfield, or Cranford campus of Union County College. Nursing (NURE) courses are conducted by the School of Nursing on the Elizabeth Campus.

Students may be granted up to 22 college credits of advanced standing toward the Associate Degree. Students with a degree may be eligible for the Diploma only option.

CURRICULUM DESIGN

Day/Evening Courses 15 week semesters

Transfer credit for college courses requires grades of "C" or better.

Effective January 2011, ADM 110, Keyboarding and Computer Skills for Nursing, will be a prerequisite for NURE 130/211/212.

Effective January 2013, only PSY 204 will be accepted as a graduation requirement. Prior to January 2013, either PSY 204 or 205 will be accepted for graduation.
